


# Beloved! Let us keep the fire burning.

In 2 Timothy 1:6, Paul urges Timothy to rekindle the Holy Spirit's fire in his heart amidst turmoil in the church and persecutors. He faces issues testing his faith and losing spiritual fervour.

To us at this time, overcoming personal challenges and unclear ecclesiological church positions on technical issues is something we have to look at together prayerfully. Jesus does not explain the suffering and pain in the world. He takes it upon himself to go where the pain is most significant. He does not address the questions of why there is death, disease, and suffering in the world. He offers hope and healing.

Even in the face of future uncertainties, we are called upon to keep the fire in our hearts burning. This is not a passive call but an active one that requires our strong desire for prayer, our appetite for the word, our pursuit of personal holiness, and our regular church attendance. Let us remember that we are pilgrims and strangers in this fleeting world and follow the example of our master, the author and perfecter of our faith.

### Sunday 6th October - Harvest Service.



Remembering how much God blesses us with food and all we need, in this service we have opportunity to give back to others with gifts of food and other items which will then be given to The Well Foodbank (especially needed are: UHT milk, toiletries, tinned tomatoes, tinned meat, packets of dried pasta and tinned potatoes, or maybe a treat for a family or their children!). Please bring them with you and place them on the tables provided at the front of church. As usual gifts can also still be left in the basket in the entrance foyer or you can give any financial donations to Nick or Jessica.

A message from Catherine Tromans - It's the time of year again when Samaritans Purse launch their Operation Christmas Child where we fill shoe boxes with gifts for underprivileged children around the world. As in previous years we shall be supporting this initiative as a church and this year we are being a "drop off" point for the local community. There are various ways that you can support this appeal including physically filling a shoebox with toys and gifts for a child in need, filling a virtual shoebox online, and praying for the children who will be the recipients.

The national collection week is 11th-18th November, so all shoeboxes will need to be received by 18th November, although virtual shoeboxes can be donated online until 24th December. Leaflets shall soon be available and please take an extra few to share locally, shoeboxes are also available for a donation of 50p. Thank you Catherine.
