
Easter challenges us to reevaluate our perspectives and explore the transformational potential of faith in Jesus Christ in a time marked by scepticism and doubt.

You may notice that some of the regular monthly activities are missing. This is because of the timing of Easter this year and will be back to the usual pattern in May.

# Sponsor-A-Tile Appeal

If you have been into our church when there are no chairs or tables out, you will have seen that our floor is heavily stained in places, so the DCC have agreed a plan to raise funds for the tiles to be replaced by a new carpet.



There are around 340 tiles and it was worked out it requires a minimum donation of £7 per tile to raise the money. This is represented on a chart in church and some envelopes are provided for donations, so that they can easily be identified and counted separately - either on the collection plate or in our spare change jar. We need to raise around £2,000 and the spare change jar has kick-started the appeal with more than £300, which is a really good start. A big thank you if you have been a giving pioneer!

If your regular giving is directly to the bank, you can use the same details to give a separate donation but please do make sure that you add the reference CARPET so that the treasurer knows to allocate it to the correct fund (eventually the building fund).

In the event that we raise more than we need for the carpet we will use the excess towards decorating and refurbishment.

We have chosen to fund raise rather than simply use money from the church accounts because our finances have taken a bit of a battering since the start of the year; if you were at the AGM, you will have heard the finance report and a more detailed explanation of this. Our treasurer, Mike, took the opportunity to encourage those who are tax payers to consider gift aiding their giving so that the church can benefit from recovering tax - this means that the church gains £1.25 for every £5 you give and perhaps, if you haven't reviewed your regular giving for a while, this might be an opportunity to revise your tithe too?
